A Message from the CEO



Kiwanis Community Partnership

Children of all ages can enjoy the benefits of experiential learning and cross-generation relationships through school-community partnerships. The Kiwanis Club of Allentown has been a long-time partner of LVCC. The Kiwanis Club has offered numerous community involvement experiences for our families and children. In March, they visited our LVCC Muhlenberg Elementary school-age program and created a Read Across America event. They donated books of various reading levels for the children to read at home and within the center in small groups.

The Kiwanis Club of Allentown created two large interactive events again this year for our Pre-K children.



Kiwanis Picnic

In May, Kiwanis members and LVCC teachers had a picnic with games and activities for the children. The event had over 200 children attend, with local school district's Key Clubs volunteering and assisting Kiwanis members to put on this wonderful event. This event means so much to our children who get to explore different activities and interact through an intergenerational program.

Annual Holiday Party

The Kiwanis Club of Allentown also holds an annual holiday party for our children that comprises volunteers from local Key Clubs, Kiwanis members, and LVCC teachers. The event allows children to participate in singing, dancing, and holiday-themed activities. The event featured a visit from Santa Claus, and each child got a personalized photo of them with Santa along with a special gift donated from Toys For Tots.

LVCC is very grateful for the Kiwanis Club of Allentown and all of its partners. When an organization establishes a community partner, both the organization and the community grow. It is truly a full collaboration for our families, children, and community.



Subsidized Programs

Pre-K Counts and ITCS

LVCC is proud to provide Pennsylvania's state-funded preschool program, Pre-K Counts. The program is free for those who qualify and operates on an academic calendar year (September - June).

If a child is currently three or four years old and their household income falls at or below 300% of the federal poverty level (approx. \$90,000 annually for a family of four), the family may apply for Pre-K Counts.

Children are selected based on age, income, developmental delays, and other risk factors. Families of children younger than three receive help as well with our Infant Toddler Contracted Slots (ITCS) program at select LVCC locations. The program serves Child Care Works eligible infants and toddlers via contracted slots at a ZERO co-pay cost to families and operates year round.



At home learning with Waterford

Lehigh Valley Children's Centers engages The Waterford Early Learning as a supplemental curriculum. Through evidence-based research and the science of reading, each student's reading development is optimized to accelerate learning and provides targeted intervention.

Learners develop foundational math, science, and literacy skills through an adaptive learning path. Authentic texts and engaging songs develop academic vocabulary and background knowledge aligned to Common Core and state standards.

Food Program

The Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) ensures that children in child care settings receive nutritious, well balanced meals. Through an agreement with the Pennsylvania Department of Education, LVCC serves as a sponsor for this federal program. Our goal is to improve the diet for children 6 weeks to 12 years of age by providing training and reimbursing child care providers for the nutritious meals and snacks they serve.



Teen Parent Program

The area's only teen parent program at William Allen High School serves children from ages 6 weeks through 36 months to parents enrolled in the Allentown School District.

Preparing for Education after LVCC

LVCC utilizes Gearing Up for Kindergarten, a proven curriculum from North Dakota State University to get children ready for the next part of their educational journey. LVCC understands that entering kindergarten is a major transition in a child and family's life. Children need to have the support that readies them for school. This curriculum is a family involvement program that supports child development, school readiness, and healthy parenting.

LVCC uses the curriculum to help families and children in the summer months prepare for the school year ahead. This year, we partnered with the Allentown and Whitehall Coplay School Districts to ensure children receiving summer preschool services were equipped to succeed at the next level.



Learning continues at school age

Children K-6 can continue learning at one of our 23 centers before and after school. The Summer Explorers Program helps prevent the regression of academic excellence during the summer with engaging educational guests and trips!



Measuring Success of our Children


Understanding a child's needs based on developmentally appropriate milestones allows teachers at LVCC to individualize lesson planning for each child to succeed. Children enrolled in a LVCC classroom grow within the areas of social-emotional, language, cognitive, and physical development.

LVCC measures development using the accepted assessment by the Pennsylvania Office of Child Development and Early Learning (OCDEL) - Teaching Strategies GOLD; which follows widely held expectations for children from birth through third grade.




Infant/Toddler

A 27% INCREASE Physical expectations improved the most from Fall to Spring, with 85% of children meeting or exceeding expectations in the Spring compared to 58% of children the previous Fall.

Literacy before kindergarten

LVCC focuses on literacy at every age level. Early literacy plays a key role in enabling early learning experiences associated with academic achievement, reduced grade retention, higher graduation rates, and enhanced productivity later in life. It is essential in giving children a head start before going to kindergarten.

LVCC utilizes Preschool Early Literacy Indicators (PELI) to measure essential pre-literacy and oral language skills needed for kindergarten.

The PELI assessment measures alphabet knowledge, vocabulary and oral language, phonological awareness, and listening comprehension.

Teach Me To Read At Home

Planning and organizing a successful family literacy training requires many considerations. LVCC throughout our Pre-K/Preschool school year has implemented “Teach Me To Read At Home” over the past 5 years. This program is designed to enable parents to continue to be their child’s first teacher.

4 defined outcomes upon workshop completion

- Family members are engaged and responsive.
- Family members ensure child-based activities for in-home learning are explored.
- Children gain and begin to develop early literacy skills.
- Children learn to read without struggling.

“Teach Me To Read At Home” is designed for success! Each section builds on the previous section, and is developed for both family and children to succeed when they are going through the activities. LVCC invests fully in family engagement because when all of the pieces of the puzzle are together everyone achieves more, and the child is ready for their future.

Our new facilities and play spaces represent our commitment to providing the highest quality educational environments while keeping access to childcare equitable, accessible, and affordable.
